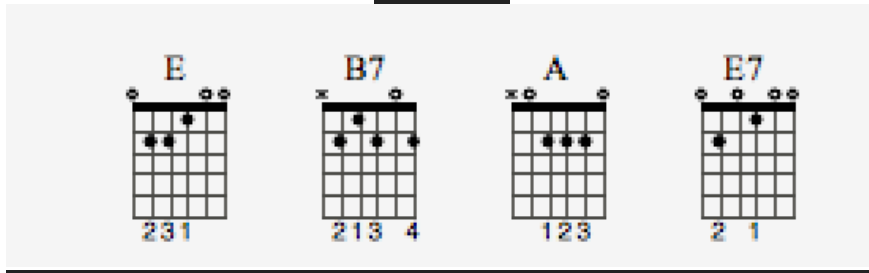


Lucille
